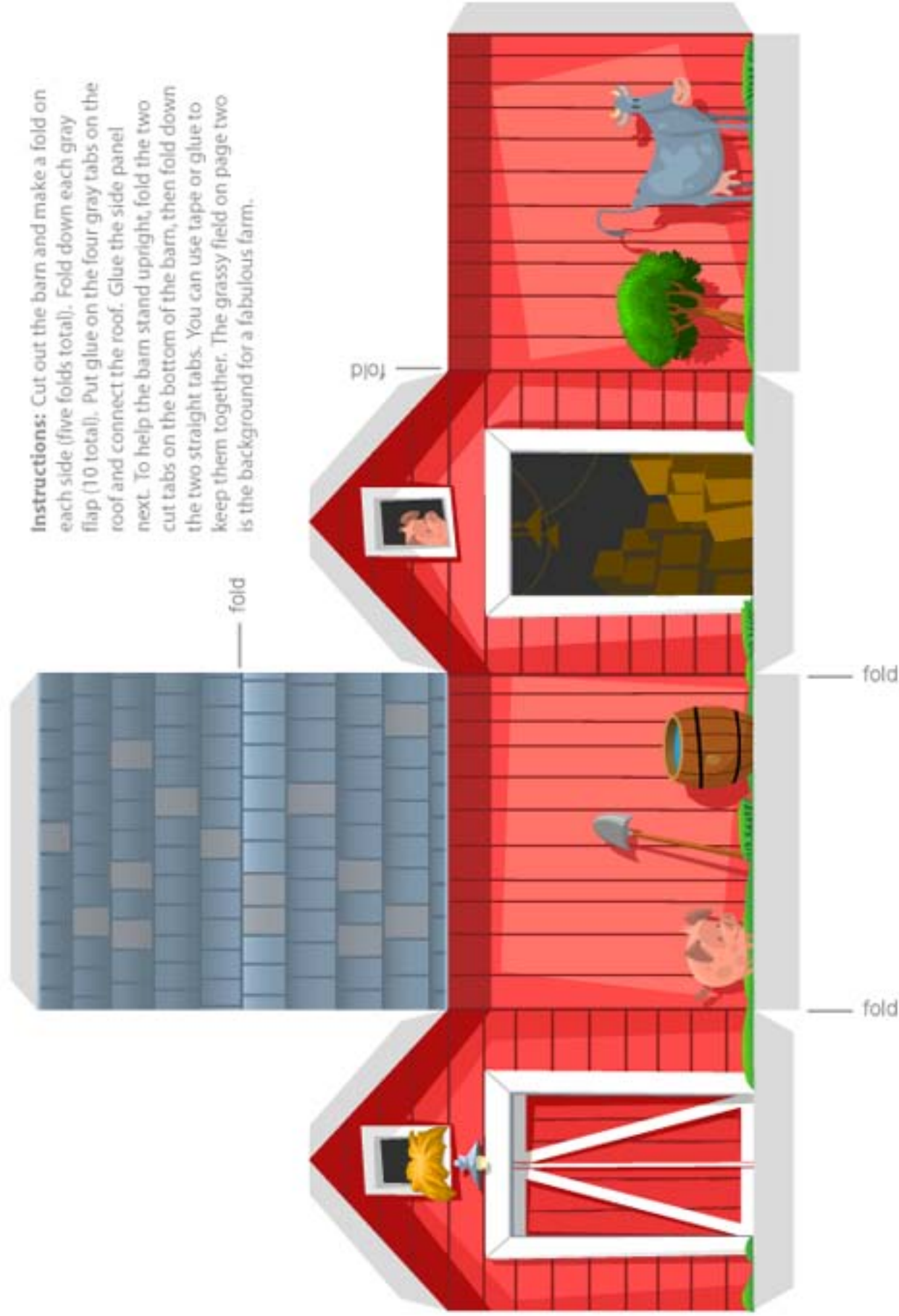
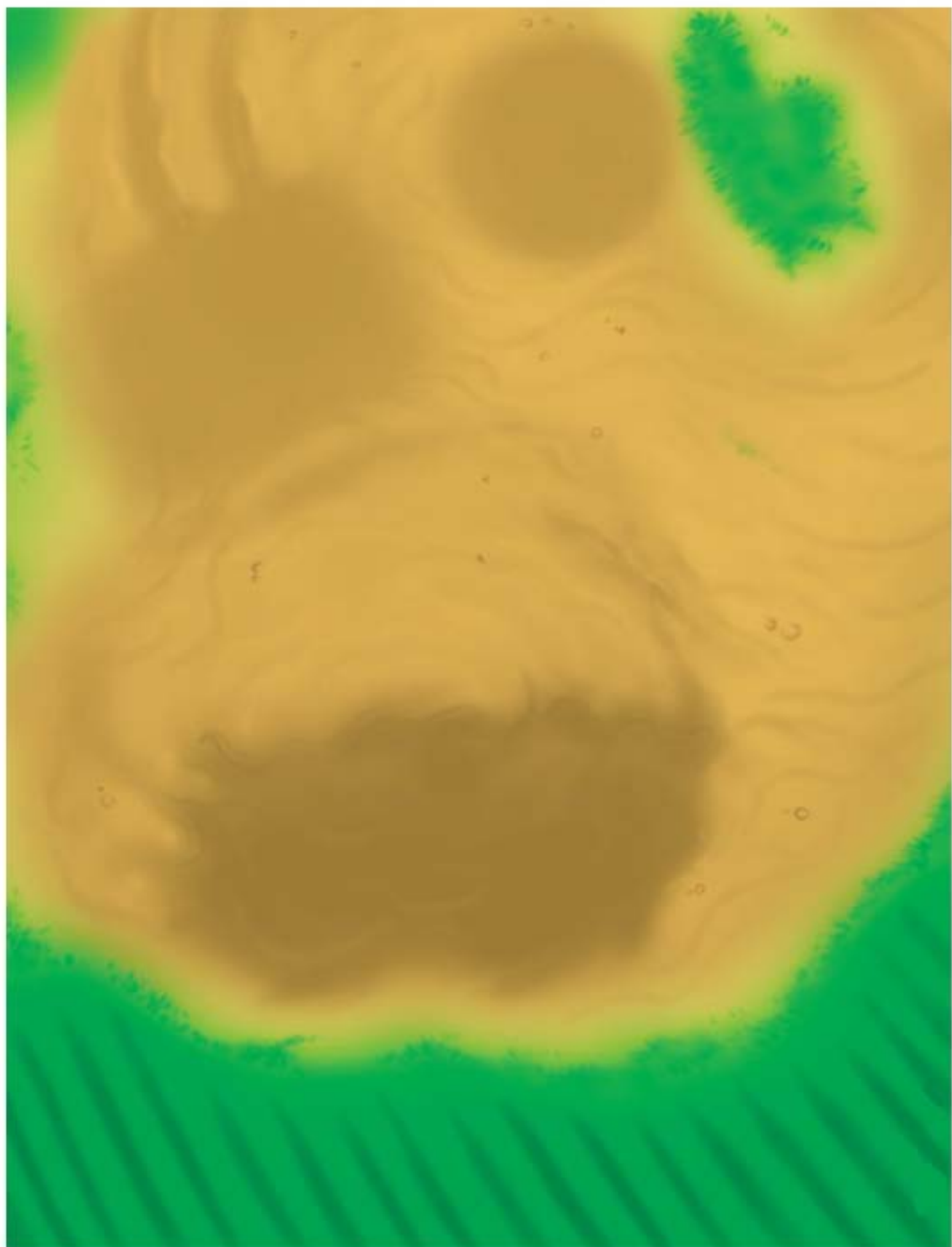


Build a Barnyard Scene: Barn

Calling all future farmers and animal lovers! Cut and paste this easy paper project for oodles of farmland fun.

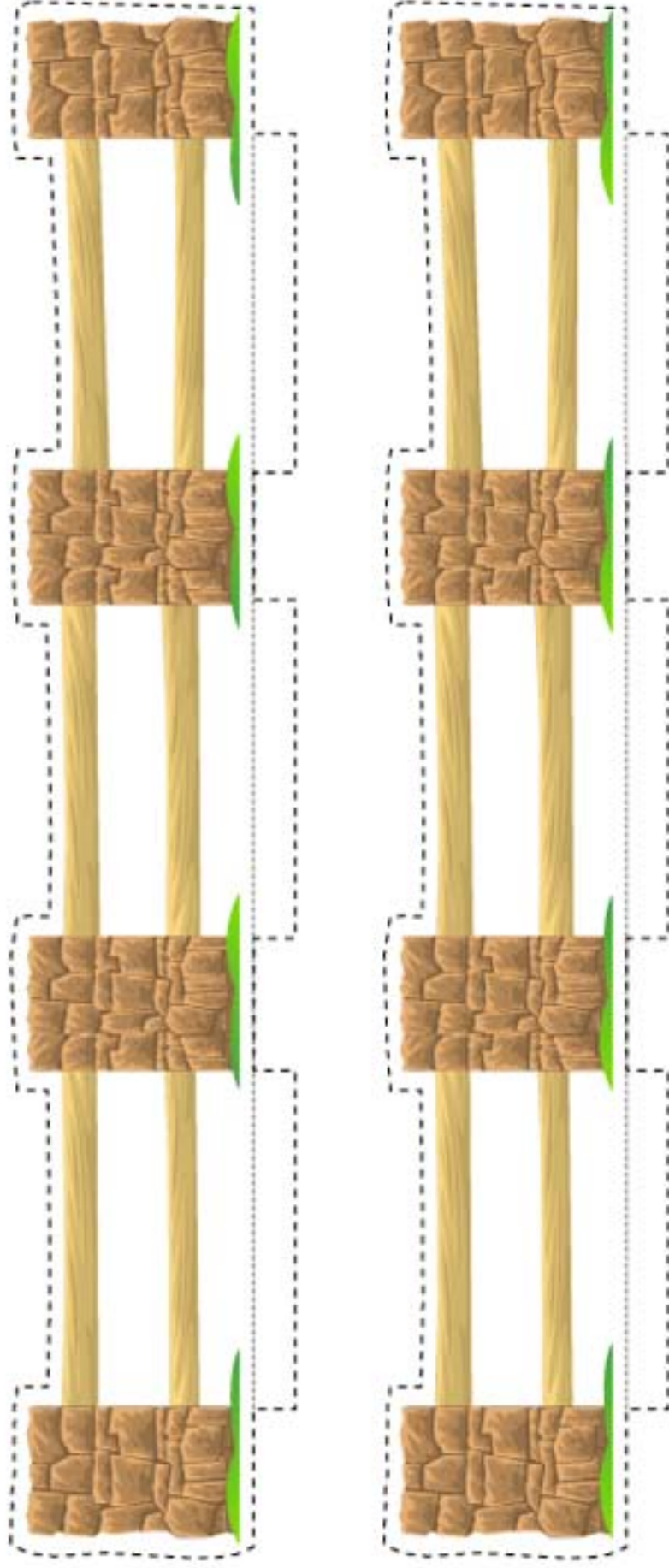
Instructions: Cut out the barn and make a fold on each side (five folds total). Fold down each gray flap (10 total). Put glue on the four gray tabs on the roof and connect the roof. Glue the side panel next. To help the barn stand upright, fold the two cut tabs on the bottom of the barn, then fold down the two straight tabs. You can use tape or glue to keep them together. The grassy field on page two is the background for a fabulous farm.



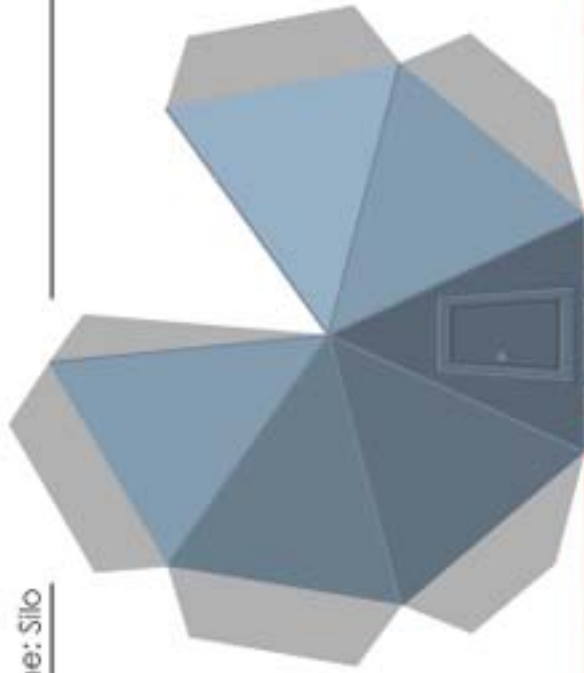


Build a Barnyard Scene: Fences

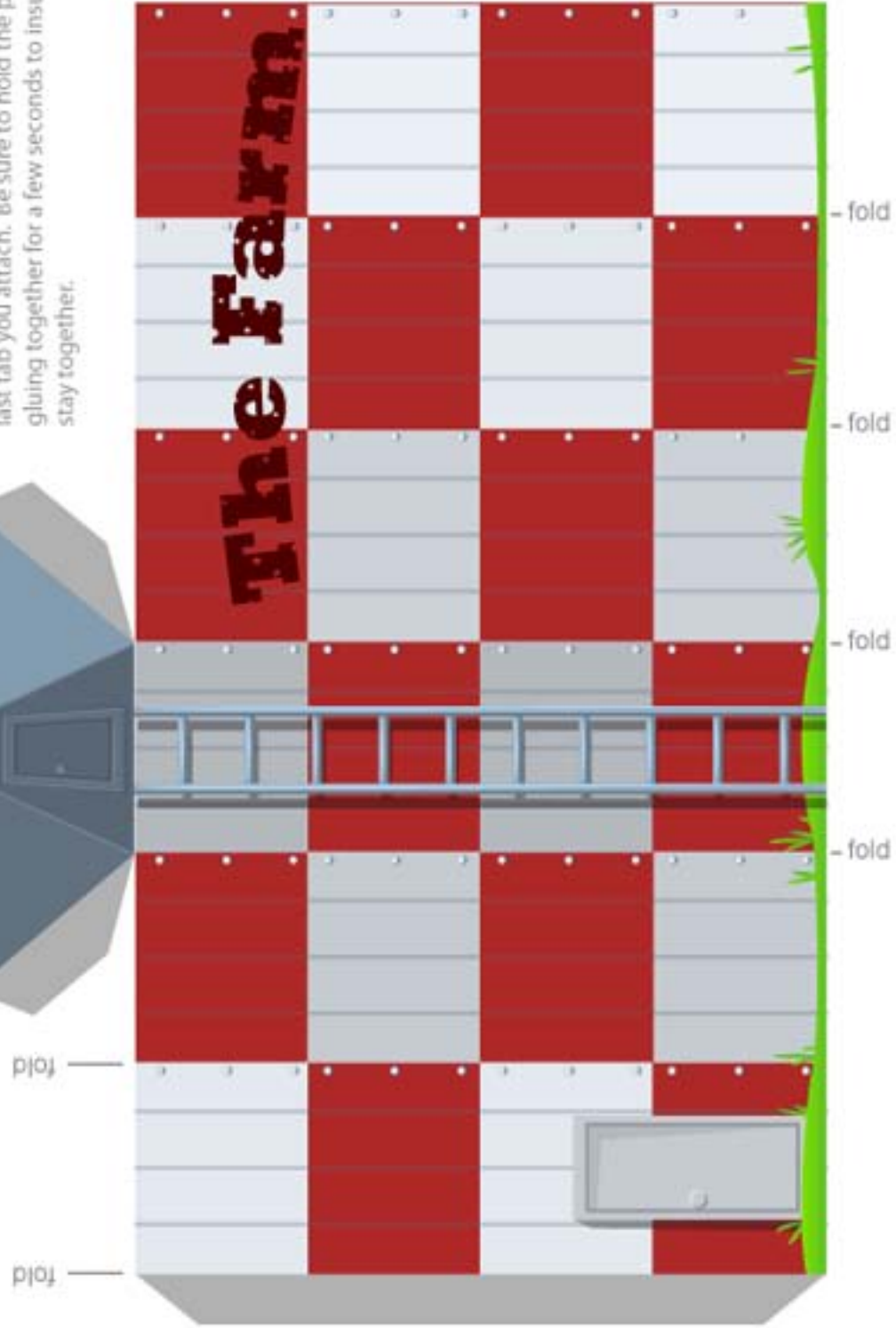
Instructions: Cut out the fences along the dotted lines. If you choose, use a craft knife to cut out the mid-section. This step will allow you to see "through" the fence. Fold the bottom tabs in opposite directions so that the fence can stand upright. You can also fold the fence wherever you desire so that it surrounds your barnyard scene. Print out multiple pages of the fences to add more life to your scene!



Build a Barnyard Scene: Silo



Instructions: Cut out the silo and fold each side (five folds total) so that it begins to take the shape of a hexagon. Fold down each gray flap on the roof (including the flap on the side of the silo) so that you can attach them to the inside of the silo. Starting with the tab at the top of the roof, glue the roof together. Working from the left of the ladder, attach the gray tabs to the inside of the silo with glue or tape, finishing with the two tabs to the right of the ladder. The seam down the side of the silo should be the last tab you attach. Be sure to hold the pieces you are gluing together for a few seconds to insure that the sides stay together.



Build a Barnyard Scene: Animals & Tree

Instructions: Cut out the animals and trees along the dotted lines. Place glue or double-stick tape between the two pieces and stick the pieces together. Fold the bottom tab so that the animals and trees can stand upright. Print out multiple pages to add more life to your scene!
