Hop and leap your way to the princess who will grant you lifetime access to the beautiful pond at her castle in the distance.

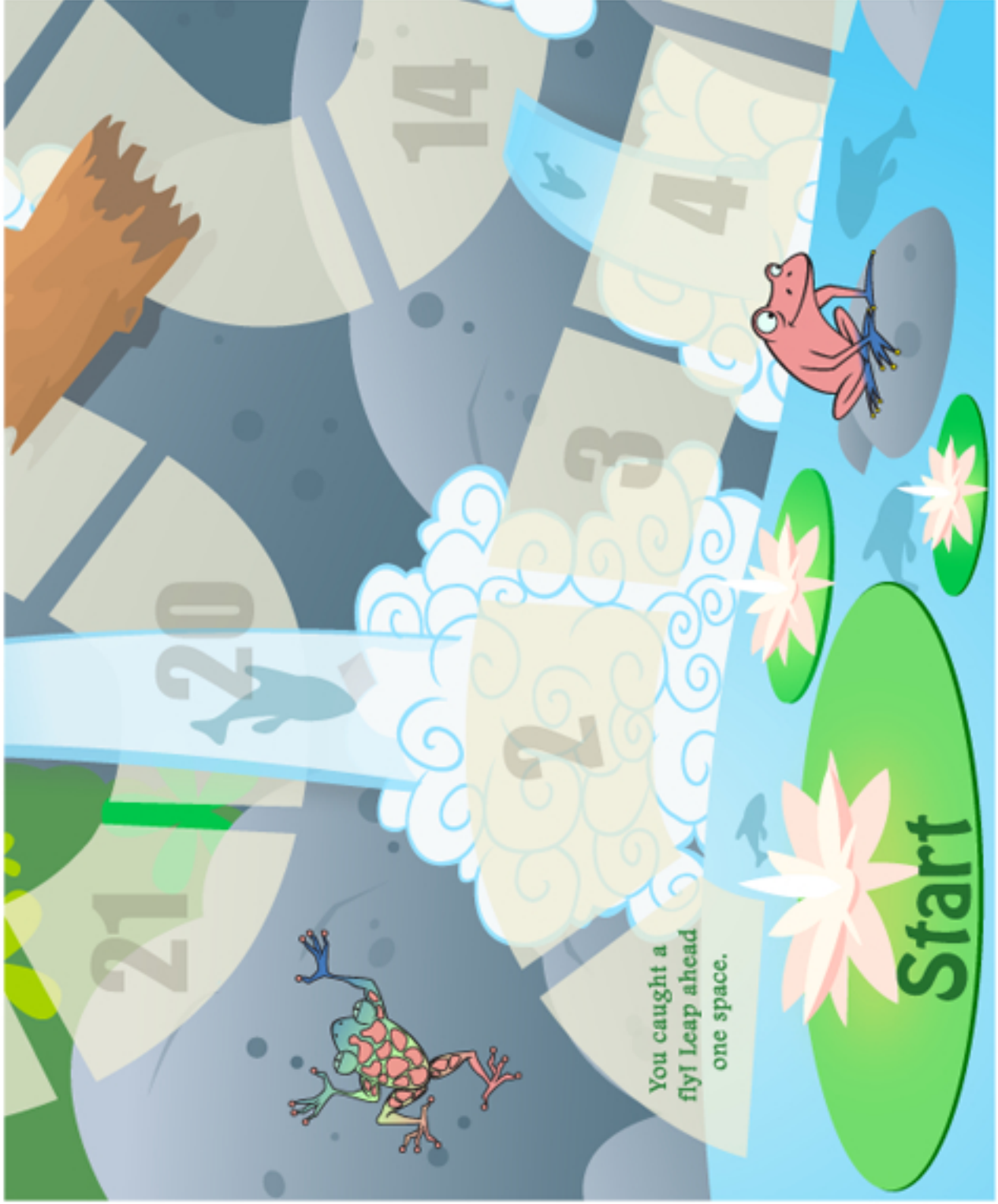

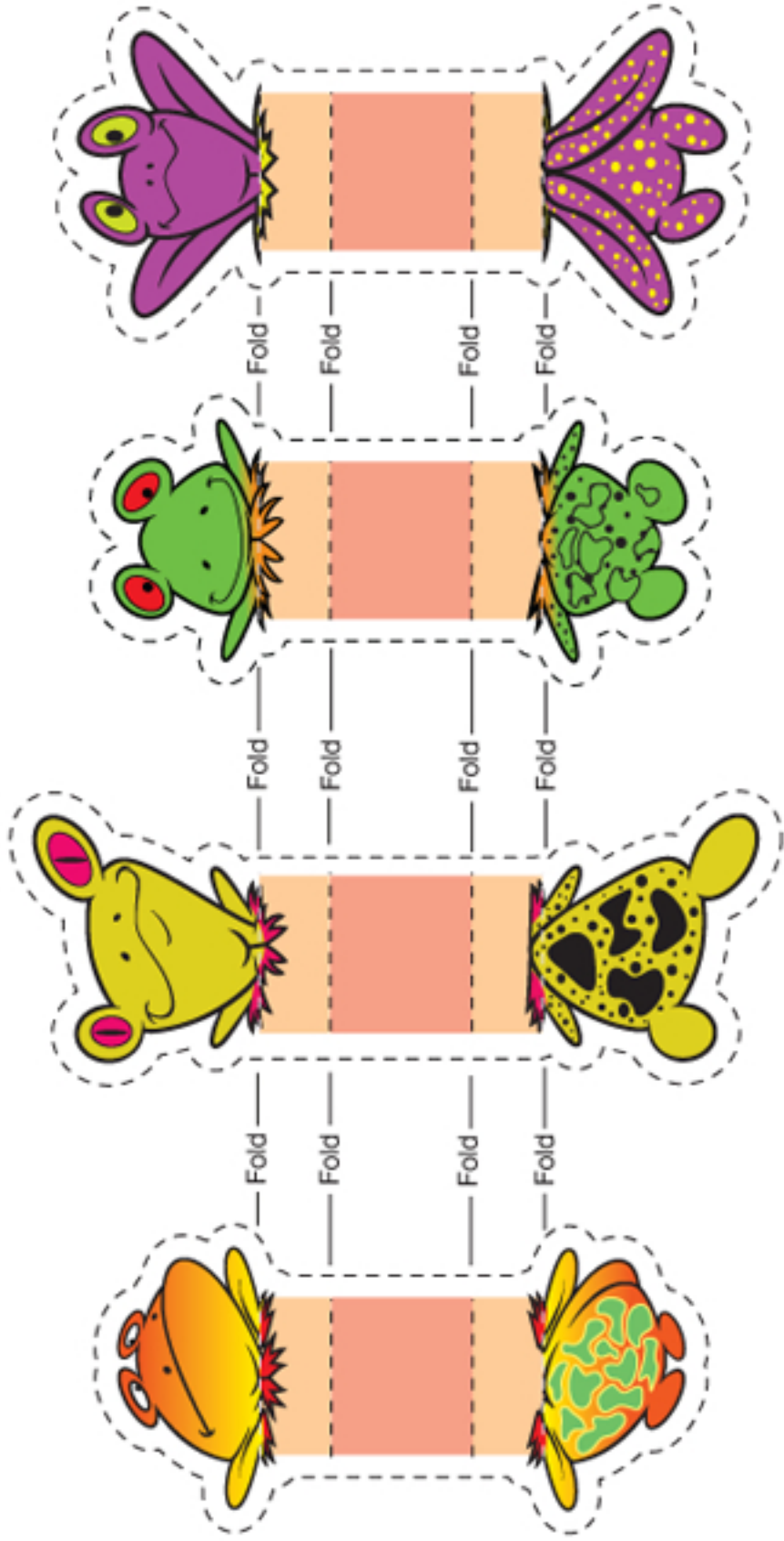


You caught a fly! Leap ahead one space.

Leap Froggin': Game Pieces and Instructions

Cut out the game pieces along the dotted lines. Make the indicated folds away from you, then glue or tape the backsides of the frogs together.



Leap Froggin': Game Pieces and Instructions

These frogs are all attempting to make it through the 29 squares (the same amount of days in the month of February during a leap year) in order to make it to the princess. Whichever frog makes it to the princess first will have the privilege of living in the frog-tastic pond at the castle. Not sure what to do with your extra day this February? How about spending it playing board games with your family?

Game Board & Pieces

There are four pages that make up the game board. You can tape or glue them together. If you want, you can then paste the entire game board on a piece of cardboard.

In addition to the board game and the frog game pieces you will need one die. The die will determine how far you advance on the game board.

How to Play

Once you choose your frog game piece, be sure to give him or her a fun name. Then, roll the die to determine who goes first. The person with the highest number should go first.

Take turns rolling the die and advancing your frog on the game board.

When you land directly on a square that contains a log, you can "hop" ahead. For instance, if you land on square six, you'll immediately advance to square 12.

When you land directly on a square that contains the top of a waterfall, you will have to "fall back." For instance, if you land on square 24, you would fall back to square two!

The frog that arrives at square 29 first wins the game and can live happily ever after in the castle pond for as long as he or she likes.
